## UTT Series Book III: Worldviews Overview

Course Description: Worldviews is the third volume in the four-part Understanding the Times Series. This course presents the Christian worldview content within a comparative framework of five other influential worldviews. This course equips students to knowledgeably and confidently engage in real-life conversations with sensitivity and critical thinking. Each chapter starts with a relevant story to connect students to previous knowledge, includes a factual presentation of the six worldviews, and how each attempts to answer life's big questions. Each chapter assesses main ideas, key Bible verses, key works, and key names. Along with the Student Manual, this course uses Scripture and a Student Textbook as primary texts to:

- inspire students to grow in awareness that everyone has a worldview and to understand the beauty and reason in pursuing Christ through the biblical worldview.
- guide students through a comparative analysis of other major worldviews (Islam, secularism, Marxism, new spirituality, and postmodernism), the beliefs each worldview has about reality, and how these worldviews attempt to answer life's big questions.
- explore why people are attracted to nonbiblical worldviews and ways worldviews are expressed through ten significant fields of academic discipline: theology, philosophy, ethics, biology, psychology, sociology, law, politics, economics, and history.
- · demonstrate how the Christian worldview best answers life's big questions with God's truth that corresponds with ultimate reality.
- equip students to examine the role of worldview in processing real-life experience and to display the transformative work through Christ alone that fuels a flourishing life.
