



#1: STRONG CONVICTIONS BASED ON A BIBLICAL WORLDVIEW


WORLDVIEW:






THE CHURCH IS A BODY

1 Corinthians 12:12-13 - For just as the body is one and has many $\,$ members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ.


